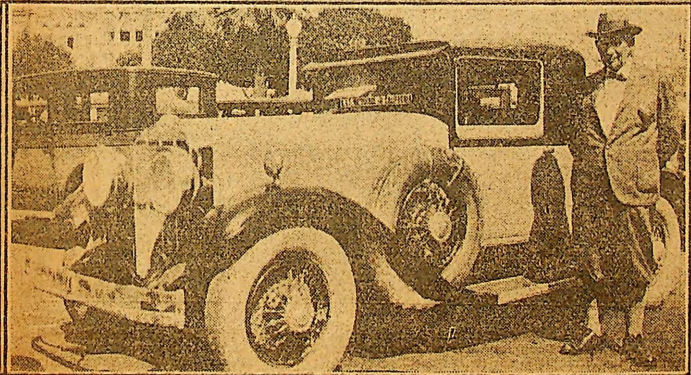
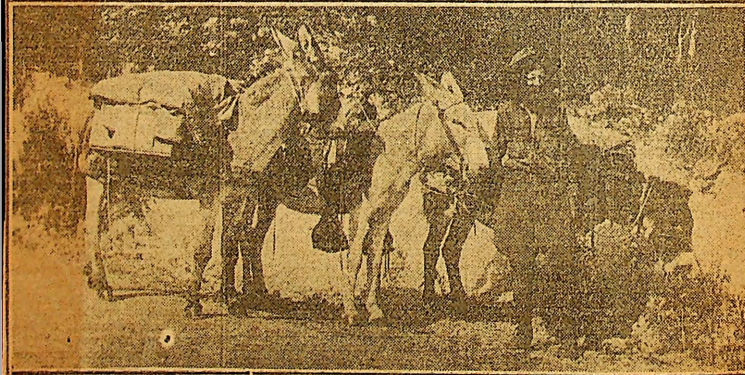
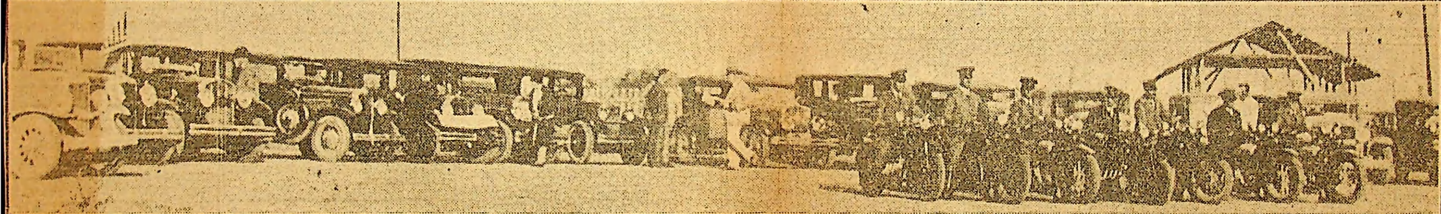


O. S. T. Motorcade Through San Antonio



Above is a picture of the old Spanish Trail Motorcade, a caravan of automobiles that started at St. Augustine, Florida, and has as its destination San Diego, California. They travel the entire route over the old Spanish Trail, one of America's most interesting trans-continental highways. The San Antonio police escort that met the motorcade 10 miles out and escorted the body into the city, is shown in front of the group as it lined up at Exposition grounds for the picture. Lower right shows O. H. L. Wernicke of Pensacola, manager of the motorcade, in his Franklin coupe that acted as a pilot car throughout the trip. He is affectionately known as "Dad" by the members of the motorcade. He is a very enthusiastic supporter of the Old Spanish Trail and proposes later to promote a trans-continental run over this course. The Cannon Ball Baker, famous Franklin test pilot, to establish a new trans-continental record and further bring the historic trail before the eyes of the Nation. Lower left shows a different kind of caravan which was in San Antonio during the time the motorcade passed through here last Tuesday. This is Arizona Bill, himself, with his trio of companions. He is on the Eastward trip from San Diego, over the same Old Spanish Trail, and has been nine months en route to San Antonio. He is being entertained here while awaiting the Old Trail Drivers' convention, and his headquarters at Wolf's Inn.
