While I sympathise with and understand the delays in the matter of reports and decisions, I am nevertheless in the position of having knowledge of these improper conditions and of continuing to consent to their present continuance, and also of allowing, thru these delays, continued activities that are making matters worse. Mr. Graebner has been since last Wednesday proceeding to get a meeting of the Advisory Board.

We should have a meeting and decisions.

In addition to the things that are happening because of these delays I am personally spending \$5 00 a day for living expenses, and my time, and men as a rule do not very willingly do this sort of thing.

I think your committee should get behind Mr. Graebner and help avoid any unnecessary delay.
