#### THE WEST TEXAS COUNTRY

The land of great ranches, sheep, goats and cattle, and land of a great-hearted people. Land of hills, plateaus, valleys and clear-water rivers, and of arid ranges. then of great springs that flood from the rocks and feed the rivers, or that are made to irrigate the land and produce all manner of products.

It is 598 miles from San Antonio to El Paso by the Old Spanish Trail-a trail across an empire. Elevations at San Antonio begin with 800 ft. From Boerne to the Davis Mountains the elevations range from 1400 ft. at Boerne to the "town a mile high" at Ft. Davis.

The country of the Guadalupe and Llano rivers, Boerne to Junction, is a hill and playground country of singular beauty, opened now by a new road planned and built to serve and please the people. Across the big ranches, through Junction, Sonora, Ozona, Sheffield and Ft. Stockton to Balmorhea and Ft. Davis are great reaches of pioneer country, and a people and towns that welcome vou.

The Davis Mts. have peaks 9000 ft. high, and ranches on the high plateaus. Their trails, for car or cow pony, furnish a different picture daily of God's wonderful handiwork. These mountains will become a state park reservation and become the only all-year mountain playground in the United States. El Paso has an elevation of 3800 ft. The temperatures of the West Texas country are dry and clear, so clear the stars hang like a thickly jeweled canopy close overhead.
