"Linder the first head the burean advises that checks be kept under lock and key; that they be numbered serially, anc hat the paper be on some special desigo or fabric that will be extremely diuticul to successtully imitat
To grard against loss by improper rawing of the check, the drawer should never have a check typewritten, but should have the payecs name penwritten in a good quality of ink. The figtres also should be trititen in ink, with a minimum of space between each figise in the amount. Where the amount riting hould begin as bose post be to the left-hand margin and the unilled space to the right filled in with wo way lines, preciably in ink of difierent color.

sanmes to get maw of the forgery operations is to rob the mail boses apartment houses and loft buildings. Where this is done they follow close in the wake of the letter earrier on the frst morning delivery, and the construction of the mail boxes now gener ally. in use is such that an expert ha no great dificuly in extracting the letters he is after. Once in hand he rifles them, appropriates the chiceks, and wherever they are of the primitive type that lack carcful drawing or any sort of saicguard, he skillfully changes the names of the payees and the amounts Hundreds of thoysands of dollars are lost right in New York through thi 4.
