SIR:

Supplementing the letter of Mr. Palmer Pillsen, President of the Old Spanish Trail Association, written to you pursuant to instruction of the Old Spanish Trail Association Convention at Tallahassee assembled, and in connection with a letter to you of April 10th. last from the National Highways Association; I beg to state that the said convention, at the same time that it instructed the writing of the letter which was written by the President of the Association, unanimously adopted the Resolutions hereinafter set out:

RESOLVED: That the Old Spanish Trail Association in Convention assembled at Tallahassee, does hereby most heartily endorse the offer of the National Highways Association as set forth in their letter of April 10th, 1917, to the Honorable Woodrow Wilson, President of these United States.

RESOLVED: Further that the peculiar fitness of the Old Spanish Trail as a marginal military highway along the Gulf of Mexico and the Mexican border, be also called to the attention of the President of these United States, and that the Old Spanish Trail be and hereby is offered to the Government for such purpose.

RESOLVED: Further that the Secretary be instructed to send copy of these Resolutions to the said Honorable Woodrow Wilson, President of these United States.
