(Have used our records and understandings of today and have made the Terán and the Ramón records clear; their purposes, their failures, their successes have been defined. This is a necessary understanding background to the understanding of many things in Spanish pioneer history. The Terán expedition stands forth as a great undertaking, and explains why the Spaniards abandoned N.E. Texas from 1693 to 1716.)
- 31 Groundwork data for old Spanish tourist map of the northern Spanish country; San Antonio to La Bahía and Corpus Christi, and south to Monterrey and Saltillo, and west to Eagle Pass and Monclova.
