RESOLUTION FOUR-STATES GULF COAST CONFERENCE
Mobile, March 20 and 21, 1922.

RESOLVED, That we designate the Pensacola-Mobile-Mississippi Gulf-New Orleans section of the Old Spanish Trail as the GULF COAST BOULEVARD, and that it be given primary recognition in construction program.

WE BELIEVE this Gulf Coast Boulevard will develop into national recognition and popularity and bring great prosperity thru the the social, commercial and agricultural development that will result. We recognize this southern transcontinental highway must become the reservoir of all north and south highways and that its construction according to the highest federal standards is necessary in order that it may carry the traffic that will flow into it from the southern bound highways building in all the states.

WE ALSO RECOGNIZE that the completion of this section of the Old Spanish Trail is now immediately essential to meet the construction in progress or financed and ready, both eastward and westward, or we will be blocking instead of opening this highway from the Atlantic to the Pacific and to Mexico.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That when this Conference adjourns it adjourns to meet in annual conference hereafter, and that we hereby elect for one year a President, a Vice-President and a Secretary of the Conference.

FURTHER RESOLVED, That a continuing force be put behind this Gulf Coast Boulevard and to this end we ask the national administration of the Old Spanish Trail to build up its branches in all the communities of this Gulf Coast section, give to its development the services of its personnel, and we hereby pledge our support and cooperation in our several communities.
