A convention for the dedication of the King's Highway or El Camino Real which passes through San Antonio from Mexico to Mississippi, will be held in San Pedro Park at 3 p. m., February 21, under the auspices of the National Society of the Daughters of the American Revolution, according to announcement from the Chamber of Commerce is co-operating with the D. A. R. in making arrangements for the affair.

Tentative plans for the dedication of the historic old King's Highway were submitted by letter to the Chamber of Commerce by Mrs. Lipscomb Norvell of Beaumont, State regent of the National Society of the Daughters of the American Revolution. 
