Flag of Colombia.



a quarter flag of Red, gold & silver - standard of Castile and Leon - is generally accepted as having been the first European banner flown on Am. soil. This truly royal standard was planted on the beach before the startled gaze of the awe-struck aborigines when Ch. Col., richly clad, set foot on shore Oct. 12, 1492, and, in the name of their Cast. Majesty, J + F, formally took possession of the island which he called San Salvador, but which is believed to have been what is now known as Watling I. in the Bahamas.

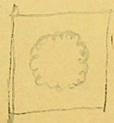
