Gentlemen:-

A meeting of Automobile Clubs, representing the Southeastern states has been called by the American Automobile Association to be held in Jacksonville, January 5 and 6.

Every club, and every Chamber of Commerce in the territory affected should be represented.

You are urged to name your delegates immediately and to arrange for their presence here at that time.

The call is made officially by the American Automobile Association through the cooperation of the Jacksonville Automobile Club and the Chicago Motor Club. Charles M. Hayes, president of the latter, is now here preparing for the meeting.

This meeting will take up matters of vital importance to your organization. It will be the means of expression of ideas from representatives of more than one hundred leading clubs in Kentucky, Tennessee, North Carolina, South Carolina, Georgia, Alabama and Florida.

The principal purpose of this meeting is to plan a program of concerted action for the benefit of all participating clubs and the motoring public. This means, in short, to devise some means of providing members of all affiliated clubs with real "at home" service when they are traveling in other states. This will include free mechanical first aid, road service, legal department assistance, map and touring information and other features.

Such a plan is now working successfully in other sections under cooperation with the American Automobile Association. Hundreds of clubs elsewhere have affiliated on such a basis. We believe we should carry this work on through the southeast, through a similar program, and that clubs combining in this co-operative plan should affiliate under the A. A. A. emblem, which then puts them in harmony with hundreds of other clubs in other sections of the country operating the same kind of mutual service.

The adoption of such a plan means a greater motor traffic through your state. It means greater advertising for your state and your roads, and it means more prosperity.

We sincerely trust you will be able to have your club represented here. Kindly advise this office at your earliest convenience in this regard, sending, if possible, the names and home addresses of your delegates.
