The Chair then stated that San Antonio Chamber of Commerce pledged \$1,000.00 and wanted the Fall Convention. The Houston Chamber of Commerce then pledged \$10.00. D. R. Beatty of Houston, \$100.00 and E. W. Turnbow of Beaumont, \$100.00.

At this point, Mr. Garland E. Erickson, General Manager of the Houston Chamber of Commerce invited the party to attend the Houston Salesmanship Club Luncheon at the Rice Hotel as guests of the Chamber of Commerce, which invitation on motion by Mr. Vining was accepted and adjournment taken until 2 p.m.
