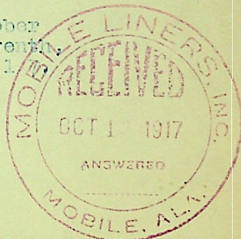

My dear Mr. LeBlanc:

I have your letter, with enclosures, and am glad my report pleased you. I enclose copy of letter sent to the Fla. State Road Department meeting. I hope it will gain results. I will keep plugging at everything and everybody, until we get the OST as we want it to be.
