INCOME QUOTA

The National Convention at New Orleans authorized a quota basis to be fixed for membership-support. This has been calculated, based upon population and bank resources. The total of the quotas for the cities of 10,000 population and over reach about \$25,000. The total, under 10,000 also reach about \$25,000. If all OST communities gave one hundred percent support the income would only meet the budget as set forth. But the Executive Board recognizes the work can only be developed gradually, and also that some department managers can develop added income to offset the failures of slacker-communities. It is certain that approximately \$50,000 in 1924 will be needed if so large a work is to be carried thru satisfactorily. Failure in any one of the departments would embarrass the whole work.

San Antonio's quota is \$4,000 She can be depended upon to oversubscribe this, if others will do their part. In the past San Antonio has given a total of \$12,278.55 in each and thousands of dollars in service for the general good.
