Your weekly bulletin dated the 19th inst., received, and read with very much interest. I note Mr. Lewis's report about the bridge across the Pascagoula river, and beg to state that I was over there some time ago, and this work is progressing very rapidly to completion.

From the West Pascagoula river through to Logtown, Miss., the road is now in good condition. That stretch fronting on the Gulf of Mexico thirty miles, from Biloxi, to Pass Christian, is all now surfaced with gravel and shells, and our beach drive is in good condition.

If you will notify me when the "Boosters' car (of which mayor D. M. Lowry, of Tallehassee is one of the party) leaves, we will meet them at Ocean Springs. or Biloxi, and show them the way through Mississippi. Flease do not fail to notify me when they arrive at Mobile.
