The meeting was called to order by Chairman Wimer, with the following members present: Wimer, Wuest, Walthall. Absent: Matthews Tyrrell The following employes of the Old coanish trail association were present: Mesers. Colp. Thompson, Shreve, Herndon and Brown. President Johnston, Managing pirector Ayres, and Chairman Graebner of the Advisory Board were also present. #The minutes of last meeting were read and approved.

#Mr. welthall presented a letter from Mr. purlong resigning from the Fracultive Committee and a letter from Chairman crashnar.

the Executive Committee and a letter from Chairman graebner accepting the resignation and appointing Mr. Tyrrell to fill the vacancy, both of which letters are on file herewith.

respectly admitals y organ #A proposed letter to be sent to all chambers of commerce in accordance with a motion adopted at the meeting of the Committee on October 33d, copy of which is on file herewith, was submitted; and read; and on motion of Mr. Walthall, was approved.

Another proposed letter to be sent to certain chambers of commerce from Lake charles to gan piego was submitted and read. The letter was approved, with the following changes and under the conditions named below. (1) That the letter shall not assert anything as a positive fact, but shall manufadire analytic through a spanish Trank state that the information contained in the letter is based on information and belief only. (8) That the letter be sent only to mann chambers of commerce at places where wrences is known to have cashed bad checks. (3) That the letter shall not in any way commit the Old granish Trail association or the precutive Committee to any action on account of the conduct of Francis. conduct of Francis.

#The employee of the Old coanieh Trail Assn. were than called upon to state the terms of their constracts of employment as they understood them to be.

WD. N. Shreve stated that in consideration of re-marking and marking where necessary, the routes of the OST and of obtaining data and ads for a directory and log book and of paying the upkeep on a car furnished by the Old granish Trail, had of paying one-half the cost of printing the log books, he received 75% of the amounts actually collected by him from subscribers for ads in the log book. He further stated that his contract was subject to termination at the will of either himself or the Old Spanish Trail Association. He also stated that he would be willing to continue in the symployment of the association under the terms sentinue in the amployment of the association under the terms of his present employment.

P. B. Thompson stated that in consideration of his work in soliciting memberships in the OST Asen. he reserved 25% of the amounts paid for memberships to him directly of to the association from any town within thirty days after he had solicited for memberships in that town; that he paid the expense of his car up-keep, furnished his own car, and paid his own expenses. He further stated that he understood his contract to be subject to termination at the will of either himself or the OST Asen. and that he was not willing to continue in the employment of the Alsociation on the same basis except for a short time.

F. M. Herndon stated that he was employed by the OST Association as publicity man at \$15 per week and that he was willing to continue in the employment of the Association in the same capacity at the same rate of compensation and to give what time was necessary to perform his duties.

#N. K. Brown, stated that he was employed by the OST Association as a clerk at \$100 per month for half time, and that he was willing to continue in the employment of the Association at the same rate of pay.
