Dear Mr. Holman:

Last June responsive to your request to Mrs. J. T. Smith, chairman of our Committee on Advertising, copy of our correspondence with the attorney generals was sent to you. Our Department of Beautification is working right ahead. Now it is desired to submit a bill to the Texas Legislature for the control or abolishment of roadside advertising and roadside desecration. The State Federation of Women's Clubs in their annual convention just held aligned themselves with us in this movement and will assist in the legislative efforts. Maybe with Mrs. Ferguson as governor this may be a peculiarly appropriate time to pass a satisfactory law.

Have you in your studies anything that will help us in the preparation of a bill for the legislature? If so, we would appreciate advices. Our committees are now proceeding to decide upon the type of law that seems best for Texas. If we can pass such a bill in this state it will, of course, help the whole general movement.
