INQUIRIES SUGGESTED

- 1 Are moneys banked and checked out with proper regard to constitutional requirements?
- 2 Are the books and accounts clearly and carefully kept?
- 3 Are old accounts paid in reasonable order, as money comes in, or are funds used for the operations of certain individuals?
- 4 What is the character of contracts made with solicitors of funds in the field?
- 5 What methods for checking up collections to establish the correctness of remittances?
- 6 Are solicitors bonded as OST rules and printed matter require?
- 7 Are collections remitted in full to Headq. or do men convert checks and funds to their own account?
- 8 Are there unfulfilled obligations due by field men, for which they have already been paid, and if so what is the Association liability thereunder?
- 9 What is the total of funds collected from the people with the promise of service to be rendered, with the service still unrendered? And what money is in the treasury, or at command, to perform this service?
- 10 Why did the Board of Directors of the Chamber of Commerce at El Paso refuse support or indorsement of the OST?

In a word, a business examination is desired with constructive criticism or suggestion.
