Dear Mr. Gardner,

I think I wrote you shortly after I returned to San Antonio that I had inaugurated a general investigation here. A group of the best citizens of San Antonio, old and loyal OST members, are proceeding with this in an orderly way. You and I are of one mind, the OST must be administered according to true business principles. We have got to do some fighting to keep it from the personal exploiters. I do not want to complicate the work of this committee by attempting any reports here. Changes will be necessary, but we will get this from a personal to a proper corporate business basis. Meanwhile it is best to just hold the boat steady, and not approve the payment of any moneys or the cashing of checks in the name of the OST.

We will try to have a directors' meeting soon, but when held the directors will have the cooperation of San Antonio citizens in the matters that will come up.
