silence in the fase of these actions.
It has beon the policy of this oxganization to bond all field men; to require all checks to be made peyable to the Association and remitted to the ollice; to have clearly defined contracts with the men; to onter all transactions on the Cash Book and to ledgerize the accounts; to deposit and disburse the moneys according to the constitution of the Assocjation; to use the assets and income of the Association to pay its obligations; to mark the Highway according to carcfully prepared specifications; to build up a sorvice for members and for the traveling public; and to keep clear of all advertising schemes and exploitation of friends.

In this period of usumpation theso policies have been ifnored. Whether this has been because of buslnoss stupidity, or Inot more discreditable motives I vill not attompt here to prove. Dete on this subject is in hand.

## A Zew illustrations will be suffic lont here:

Before I left for the Tast last January we hed planned for Section Haps to be issued containine all noedod trsvel information. This was sim. ilar to the strip map idea of other parts of tho country, so handy for infombition and travel over unconstructed highways. (1) These, if prepared as planned, would have cost $\$ 9000$ for printing 10,000, and the additional cost of a man over the route-section gathoring the fravel informtion and enough revenue to pay costs. Thore are calls from all over the country ior such infomation, and travel will be attracted to the II ighway when it is avallable. The OST is not yet ready for a complete hog Book.

The geetion laps for the Texas Han Iine showld have been ready for last sumer's travel, and all Texas and Joulsians should have been roady for the fall tourist movoment. Thero is nothing dilileult about these section map plans for any intelligent man.

A man was startod out in march and given 75, commission on his collectlons and the OSS car. On my return in Ausust I found an advertising abortion just off the press representinc to be this section map for the San intonio-orange soction. It contained no travel information. The crude maps were mange inacourate. The printing was full of exrors, and anateurish, and a reproach to the orgenization. Threcerourths of the advortising is from non-members, yet this work was intended to develop a service to members by bringing thom and the travelers into touch and by proving that the organization was working for them. Not possessing intolligenco enough to got out the travel information planned this advertising stuff was printed in the expensive colored covers of the Fistory Booklet. By phone, the printing office stated the account due as akout 85000 When the auditows tried to check up this solicitorss accounts a long list of adjustments were found necessary of items not on the books of the office, amounting to several hundrod dollars. The advortising copy for the section, San Antonio--mi paso is probably in the same mixed up condition.
