hunt this up. Pedro Ponce de Leon of Cuba, an historian, wrote to me and asked by Saint Augustine used 1513 then the Spanish Government used 1512 after searching the archives.

If you can get positive information from a life of Leo 7 1513 or about the battle of Favenna 1512 it would be a great help. Since I have been over so many old Spanish works I am inclined to accept their word on the subject. In the preface of the "Chronicles of Florida" by Barcia (D. Gabriel de Cardenas y Cano) written 1723 he writes: 'que los mar segures historiadores fonemel descubriento de la Florida por Juan Ponce de Jeon, en el ano 1512." "That the most secure historians place the discovery of Florida by Juan Ponce de Leon in the year 1512." and later on "El ano de 1513 ("Let bette Little") "The year 1513 he was established in Spain ("Au Little") By translations may not be accurate.

Hakluyt and some writers before Merrera say that Ponce sighted Florida on Palm Sunday March 27, 1512 and landed April 3d (which would then be Easter Day).

I haven't opened up my typewriter yet, so will ask you to excuse my writing by hand.
