

SLIDELL, LOUISIANA, APRIL 15th, 1922.

AT A REGULAR MONTHLY MEETING OF THE SLIDELL ASSOCIATION OF COMMERCE, held in Slidell this date, a committee was appointed to draft the following resolutions; which were unanimously adopted:

BE IT RESOLVED, by the SLIDELL ASSOCIATION OF COMMERCE, that this body goes on record as recognizing and commending, the work done and the interest manifested by the Motor League of Louisiana in the Chef-Mentour Highway and particularly the eleven (11) miles of unfinished road, which lies in St. Tammany Parish, and which when finished will complete the connection between New Orleans, the Gulf Coast and other points North and East, and for which the Citizens of St. Tammany have already voted funds sufficient to pay half of the expense of constructing this Highway, upon the written guarantee of both the Governor and the State Highway Department of Louisiana, that the remaining funds necessary for the completion of this Highway would be supplied out of the Federal Aid Road Funds in the year 1920 or 1921.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED; That the Slidell Association of Commerce and the members thereof recognize the efforts of Messrs. P. M. Milner, Say Fleming and others, and wishes to convey to them their appreciation for the assistance which they have always so readily given us.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED; That this body recognizing the necessity existing for the early completion of not only the Chef Mentour Highway but the New Orleans-Dominion Highway as well, urges upon the Louisiana Highway Commission that they start work at once to complete the small portion of the Chef Mentour Highway which remains unfinished, and also both ends of the New Orleans Eastmond Highway, as prescribed by Act 95 of the special session of the Legislature of 1921.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that a copy of these resolutions be sent to each of the New Orleans Newspapers, the local paper, the Motor League of Louisiana, the State Highway Commission, Governor John M. Parker, Mr. Walter Parker of the Association of Commerce, the road committee of Association of Commerce and the Young Men's Business Club.
