

SALADO (Creek): Salty. (Sp.) *pro. Salado*

SAN ANTONIO: Saint Anthony, (Sp.)

BEXAR (county): Bejar, title of a Spanish grandee since 1485. *Pro. Beh-ian*

SAN PEDRO: Saint Peter. Pro. San Pa-dro. (Sp.)

SEGOVIA (town): *ancient city of Spain.*

LLANO (river): A plain. Pro. Yaa-ne. (Sp.) *later became Llano. (Sp.)*

PECOS (river): Pecos, freckled. (Sp.) Pro. pay-cos. Indian tribe and a town, same name, in New Mexico.

SIERRA BLANCA (town): *white mountain. (Sp.)*

RIO GRANDE: Grande, large. Rio, river. (Sp.)

YSLETA: *(mission and settlement):* A little island or islet. (Sp.)

EL PASO: Originally el Paso del Norte, the Pass of the North. (Sp.)

SOCORRO (old mission town): *There is a desert between El Paso and Santa Fe the Indians called the Jornada del Muerto, the journey of the dead. The Indian town Socorro, north of the desert, became the mission settlement Socorro, Sp. for another town. The first mission was founded in 1650 across the Jornada del Muerto and another was founded near Ysleta.*
NEW MEXICO

NEW MEXICO: *Nueva Mexico*

MESILLA PARK: *(city):* Mesilla, small table or tableland. (Sp.) See Mesa, below.

LAS CRUCES: *(city):* The crosses. (Sp.)

RODEO: *(town):* Enclosure for cattle or a round-up. (Sp.) Pro. Ro-day-o.

ARIZONA

* ARIZONA: *not known.*

SAN BERNARDINO (valley): Saint Bernardino. (Sp.)

SAN PEDRO (river): Saint Peter. (Sp.)

TUCSON: Meaning not known; disputed. *Black base; Papago Tu-uk-so-on. Refers apparently to a dark volcanic stratum of an adjacent mountain.*

SANTA CRUZ (valley): Holy Cross. (Sp.)

SANTA CATALINA (mts.): Saint Catherine. Santa, feminine form in Spanish. *(town):*

MESA: A plateau or tableland. (Sp.)
