Action on the adoption of the map of the OST system
as now planned and recommended. The policy of the man-
agement has been to plan for the intelligent development
of OST territory and to open the fields of ancient Spanish
effort to the traveler who follows Old Spanish Trail guid-
ance. The History Booklet gives the historical background.

1. Florida.—Action on agreement with the Dixie High-
way Association and Florida leaders for the OST to waive
claims to routes to South Florida and for the Dixie High-
way to waive its claims to the OST trunkline from Talla-
hassee to Jacksonville, and to establish, for historical con-
sistency, the OST terminals at St. Augustine and at Tampa.

2. California.—What shall be the official terminal in
California?

3. Texas Borderland and Mexico.—Action on the South
