Shreve and his $75 \%$ commissionwere socretiy continued after F.B.Ayres had recell.ed him.

Q That methods for checking up collections to establish correctnems of remittances by solicitors?

A Jachine numbersd recelpt books wore in stook vith ample provisLons and. methods for protecting the money paid by the people. These recelpts wore not checke and proven as turned in. It took considerable time of an auautor to establish Shreve's accounts, then it mas shown he had beor overpaid.

Q Are solloitors bonded as OST regulations and printed matter requirap
A. No solicitor vas bonded aiter H B A leit for the East. Readrick was bonded, but he was sent out two weeks aiter H B A returned and protested against the reokless conditions.

Q Are collections remitted in full to Headquarters, or do men convert checks and funds to their own account?

A Shreve for some tine has been allowed to indorse checks and convert the money to himself, remitting only $25 \%$ to the office.

Q Are thero untulrilied obligations due by fleld men, for which they have already boen paid, and ir so what is the Association liabillity thereunder?
A It will probably cost 81000 to prepare and print the maps and travel information, and to perform othor service intended or promised the people. There is also a printing account for 10,000 booklets printed in comection with this work. These are so crude and ignorart that even the sponsers for this cruality deny their responsibility. Colp says Shreve was to pertorm this service and to pay halr this printing. Shreve has been overpaid his 75\%
Q. What is the total of funds collected from the people with the promise of service to be rendered, with the service silill un-reridered? And what money is in the treasury, or at command, to perform this serve servicer

COMAENT-The conduct of the orfice and the service of the organizatin has degenerated into a happy-go-lucky state. Established pollcies, protective methods, adopted standards, etc. have been lenored. ifemberships have not been protected; on the contrary members of long standing, and loyal communities, have been discriminated against, and the spirit that buills loyalty in organizations has been oast acido tinat men might put a few extra dollars in their pockets.
