Dear Mrs. Riegler,

I am enclosing you a letter just written Mr. Colp, also one of the bulletins which also represents a new letterhead gotten out. You can see now why it is I have had the difficulties I have had this past year with employees. The present act of course removes any question as to what I have had to contend with, and shows the tendencies of the Doctor.

I of course cannot allow my management to be interfered with in such manner, nor allow myself to become the pawn to the vanities of anyone.

I have been trying to do over here the past two months what it cost us two years to do in Texas, viz: to get the people together and make something out of the Old Spanish Trail thru here. I have taken care of all my expenses here and have sent \$300 to Headquarters to help them on expenses there. Have now a Gulf Coast Road Conference called, everybody from New Orleans to Tallahassee. All Mobile is now behind the effort, and apparently the biggest and most important convention the OST has ever had will be this conference.

I haven't time therefore to bother much with these interferences of the President, not while all these cares are on me here. March 20, 21 is the conference. It is only fair to say to you as a director how ever that neither these acts nor any similar ones will be accepted by me. At the moment I have not decided just what steps I shall take, except that I shall try to act in a way that is kindly toward all the good people there who have so nicely supported me and the work.
