7. Mir. Waltham told of his intexest in the work dating from the Convention in 1919. He, with representetives of the Chamber of Commerce, was incluential in bringing the OST Headcuarters to this city. He, too, referred to Mr. Ayres" wholemearted intereat in the work, and compared the anounts received into the troasury from all sections with that part which was given by Texas. He spoke of gexas having the direct benefit of this old Spanish Trail, and called attention the $t$ ongwhimd of the OSt tan through Texas, Spoke of the work which has been made possible by Wr. Ayres trip Eest. Ne showed the adrantage of good roads by comparing with automobile travel in othex sectione.
8. Wr. Ayres then spoke of the handing of funds received, soying thet every penny received could be accounted for except thet which was collected last year, durine his absence, and thet every possible mens h-d been tried to get en accurate accounting for that. ifr. dyres explaince that membership quotas were based on population and weath and told of the little tows out West thet had come through with $\mathbf{2 0 0 \%}$ support.
Q. Hr, Winer then said there were some decistons San Antonio had to moke. If they were in favor of the OST. they must decide whether they rousd go on with it or not。 If so, he suggested the different argenizations give ane progrem to the OST. He then asked the delegetes from the different clubs to express thetr views.
9. Mr. Orr, Auto trades Assh, confessed the t he had negheoted this work and was really ashamed that he had, but was a member, Fie sotd the meetine was a revelation to him. Sadd it would be a sheme to let a sum of $\$ 4,000,00$ ox $\$ 5,000,00$ be the ceuse of Iosine the OST. Suggested that alı get to work and roise this rund. Sugeested getting in touch with Mr. Wozre, of the Chember of commerce, and try and arrange with him as a personal proposition to supervise and orgenize this campaign work.
10. IIr. Pation, Real Estate Boord, snid he had not put money now time into the work, and that he vas sure the orgenization was a good thing, and pledged the Real Zstate Board Sor $\$ 350.00 ; \$ 10,00$ eech for 35 members.
11. Judege m. D. Henry, Iione Club, said the club would poseibly do nothing as a ciub, but members as individuals would give generously he thought, and that thexe were members in the club who could work and raise money in his c?ub, He promised program before Iidns club for OST, the other Lions present consenting.
2.3. We Wimer said we want, "not just $\$ 4,000,00$ but interest to build up pemanentiy。"
12. Mr G. F. Wroten, Conopus, will take back the message to his club. He is sure Conopus will be glad to cooperate.
13. Mr. H. A. Hirshberg, Kiwanis, says he has no a uhority but will rem For matter to the Board of Directors. Suggests joint meeting of all clubs and thinks we will get quicker action.
