Nominations from the floor being in order, L. A. Hoskins, Houston, Texas, nominated J. W. Hoopes, Houston, Texas, as Treasurer. This nomination was seconded, but was later withdrawn by Mr. Hoskins with the consent of the second.

The Committee on Nominations recommended that the President be authorized to fill the vacancies left open in the directorate, same to be submitted to the approval of the Board of Directors. Upon motion, this recommendation was carried.

The 1921 convention was invited to Orange by Mayor W. E. Lea, and to Beaumont by Mr. H. A. McDonald. The decision as to where the next convention should be held was left entirely to the Board of Directors, with the expressed sentiment that the next annual meeting in whatever form it should take in view of the divisional conferences necessary under the newly adopted reorganization plans, should go to that general section.

A resolution of thanks to the people of Gulfport, Biloxi and other coast cities was passed.

Chaplain J. J. Brokenshire, United States Navy, was introduced and spoke in the interest of the Near East Drive and the starving children of Europe.

There being no further business before the convention it then at 12:45 P. M., January 28th, 1921, upon motion, adjourned to meet at the call of the President at such time and place as he might specify in compliance with wishes of the Board of Directors of this Association, as hereinbefore provided.
