

d repaired in 1702-1706. The present Cathedral was built 1793-1797. Among the church data required from Spain are a number of documents on the Missions, the Franciscan Tree of all the Franciscan Missions from the beginning, this was made 1789 and is a large document. You will be especially interested in it. We also secured a copy of Torquemado's "Monarchia Indiana" this was written by a Franciscan in or about 1627 and printed later by Barcia about 1727. It is the earliest account of the missions in Florida. I have not yet seen it. We had part of one chapter translated by Miss Spofford from a copy in the Library of Congress. I have told Mrs. Connor that I think the New Smyrna ruins English. I do not believe that Spaniards would build an entirely different type of building in New Smyrna from those in St. Augustine built in 1690 to 1695. Besides the Turnbull colony there were other English estates below New Smyrna and the clergyman stationed there had the same salary as the one in St. Augustine, during the English period. I am expecting more data from Spain, source material. The chapel in Fort Marion is also very old, but the first chapel in the fort was in the South-west corner according to the map of 1737 and not in the middle of the North wall, as it is now.
