Dr. Johnston, however, has re-organized my office force, made the stenographer, "Private Secretary to the President" and put her on the letterhead, and given Mr. Colp a designation contrary to my arrangements. Of course I will not accept this sort of thing and serious things can happen to this work we all live unless there is some friendly way for the Doctor to realize that self-respecting men do not stand for such bings.

What would you do if you were away for awhile on business for the hotel and while away Mr. Hart made your stenographer "Secretary to the President" and put her on the letterhead, and he also made other changes in ther organization?

I have just received some statements from the office. I find that in the year 1921 I received from the OST \$750 for services. What Dr. Johnston is thinking of when a man has given service that way I don't know.

I have also taken care of all my expenses over here the past to weeks and sent \$300 over there to help them.

I expect to be back shortly after the 20th. The enclosed shows what I am doing. I expect to get this 8-mile bridge across the bay and everything lined up and GOING between New Orleans and Tallahassee. If I do all <u>difficult</u> problems will be solved. That will be some achievement for less than three months. I am very much hurt, when I am doing things like this, that such things should be pulled over there. Best of regards,
