

to his own use. At least \$715 00 appears of ~~xxxxxx~~ collections withheld by him, and even under this amazing contract he appears to have overdrawn his 75%. He was recalled, reached San Antonio Monday, but no effort is yet evident to get him to come to me.

Thompson was given 25% and furnished his own car. He was not bonded. He collected memberships. His service seems O.K.

Reddrick was sent out August 15th (after my return and with apparent effort to avoid my supervision). But he was bonded. An incorrect contract was written and signed. His work is ~~wrong~~ and will cost ~~maybe~~ \$150 00 to correct. He has been paid 33 1/3 % and given allowance for auto. *perhaps*

There is no system, order, regulation or standard followed in this work. Additionally these men are actually an interference with one another. The money melts away in excessive commissions and traveling expenses, and the OST has not at this time money to publish the literature needed and promised, or to complete the marking properly, or other service. These collections begun last March.

Francis is a man with some sort of a contract with Dr. Johnston. He has been eastward seeking money in the name of the OST; this was stopped. There is no record at the office of the agreement, and apparently the effort is to avoid disclosing the agreement. Information has been obtained of propositions Francis made to people eastward, and of the moneys he asked for, and of contracts drawn ~~but the signing held up.~~ *agreed upon for the payment of money.*
