Washington, March 10.—Plans for the completion of the Lee highway from New York to California are so well in hand that within two years the Memorial highway will be completed, according to an announcement today by the Lee Highway Association.

A survey of road conditions, prepared by the association, state that the road from New York to Washington is hard-surfaced throughout, that of the 40-mile stretch from Washington to Bristol, Va., only a few miles are of unimproved dirt, and that the federal government had arranged to appoint a superintendent of maintenance for the Virginia roads and will arrange for necessary repairs and upkeep.

From Bristol to Knoxville, Tenn., the road is either hard-surfaced, or contracts have been let for repair of that portion unimproved, and from Knoxville to Chattanooga, a distance of 112 miles, only eighteen miles of road-bed remain to be improved.

From Chattanooga to Muscle Shoals the portion of unimproved road beds is greater than anywhere else along the highway, the association said, adding that Alabama officials had pledged their support to plans inaugurated by the association and that by December, 1923, the highway will be in perfect condition.

**FORT MYERS MOTORCADE  
REACHED SARASOTA; IS  
DUE AT TAMPA TODAY**

Tampa, March 8.—The Tamiami Trail motorcade, which started from Fort Myers this morning, arrived at Sarasota tonight, where the members were guests of the Sarasota Chamber of Commerce at dinner. A public meeting followed the dinner, at which several speakers explained the value of the proposed roadway from Miami to Tampa. The motorcade will reach Tampa at noon tomorrow, and be guests at dinner of the Tampa Board of Trade, and will leave in the afternoon for Clearwater and St. Petersburg. A large delegation will go with the "trail blazers" from here.

Some work has been done on the Tamiami Trail in Dade, Lee and Charlotte counties; Sarasota county has virtually completed its part, while all of Manatee's portion and much of Hillsborough's has been completed. The trail goes west from Miami striking the Lee county line just north of Monroe county and the gulf coast near Naples, thence northward to Fort Myers, to Punta Gorda, Sarasota, Bradenton and Tampa.
