

24. Mr. Lewis says his club will help, but thinks they will not attend a joint meeting.
25. Judge Heary backed Mr. Lewis' statement, and said that if can get to boards of directors and get them interested in coming to meeting without putting it up to members, and then lead the members on to it, we would work up more enthusiasm that way. He promised OST day in Lions Club.
26. Mr. Wimer stated that after hearing the men talk, the procedure would be to hold individual meetings. "If those here are sold then go back and sell the directors. Give OST a day at the various clubs."
27. Mr. Etheridge said he was willing to carry suggestion to Chamber of Commerce that they hold highway meeting at the next session of the membership council. They would lay down the proposition of the OST and ask what they will do. "When they understand what the men here understand they will do what the OST wants", he says.
28. Mr. Tyrrell said he thought it should be the work of the different clubs, and differed from Mr. Etheridge's suggestion as to Chamber of Commerce, for he said he had put it up to the Chamber of Commerce Board of Directors before.
29. Mr. Wroten says he is not sufficiently informed to present matter strongly enough himself, and suggests that someone versed in this project go to the various clubs and talk on this OST work. He said he would not want to take the responsibility, personally, of presenting to his club, knowing as little as he does.
30. Mr. Orr suggested that each club handle the proposition as they want to.
31. Mr. Wimer concluded the way to handle the matter was for each to go back to directors meeting; tell what they saw; try to sell directors of clubs, and get them to appoint committees and have them go into OST office and go over books and records, or anything else, then go back and report. This was put in form of motion. Motion carried.
32. Motion to adjourn carried at 2:45 P.M.
