My dear Mrs. Smith: -

In reply to your inquiry of the 25th, beg to advise that the only law we have governing billboards and advertising along the highways is embraced in the Harrelson Road Bill, passed at a recent special session of the Legislature, in which the Highway Commission is given authority to make rules and regulations with reference to traffic and obstruction of roads, and the Commission has made a rule forbidding the placing of signs on the roads and highway in a manner that would obstruct the view.
