Of interest to the Old Spanish Trail movement and Boerne is the fact that the ancient San Saba Trail ran from San Antonio thru Boerne to Fredericksburg and to the old Spanish Fort on the San Saba river in Menard County. The ruins of the old fort and other ancient Spanish works are still there.

Mr. H. J. Graham called attention to this old history and Mr. Graham and Julius H. Luckenbach of Boerne and W. M. Locke, county surveyor at San Antonio are assisting H. B. Ayres, the Managing director in developing the whole story, and the Star is promised this story for next week as an interesting bit of Christmas reading. The old Spanish Pass, near Boerne, enters into this old history, and also other spots nearby. Boerne will have many interesting reasons for helping to make the Old Spanish Trail a great highway.
