

6th. Parks should be kept up, planted with shade trees and flowers. Have benches, running water and piers where possible. Committees should oppose tourists camping in parks, hanging out the clothes and leaving trash behind them. This detracts from the Park and gives a careless outlook to the town or country.

Mrs. Storm asked if the Parliament would act on these recommendations as a body or refer them to the Resolution committee. General Discussion as to whether the Parliament would go into a permanent organization or work as part of the Federated Clubs. Mrs. J. C. Myrick asked if this Body must separate from the Federation so well organized. Mrs. P. J. Friedrichs again urged that this Parliament be careful of the word "Federation"--that we needed every man, woman in this work and must exclude no organization. Mrs. Royden Douglas of New Orleans spoke eloquently on duplication of work and against going into a permanent organization of Old Spanish Trail--favoring Departmental work and having committees from Federated Clubs to avoid the uphill work of a new organization. The Federation is willing to place its machinery at the disposal of O. S. T. and moved that this Parliament of women resolve themselves in a department of Federation. Mrs. W. W. Forwood asked that the literature be sent out through the Old Spanish Trail and not federation literature. Miss Florence Huberwald favored Parliament having own committees--no organization. Miss Neal stated that the Spanish Trail needed the support of women--cannot hurry this through. After much discussion both pro and con, Mrs. J. C. Myrick suggested that a Director General be appointed by the Men's Organization and that she appoint a council of women in every state, one from each organization to help in the work of Beautifying highways.

Mrs. Miles moved to accept Mrs. Enochs proposition to have a Central Head and that each state work out its own problems to have a committee to be known as the Spanish Trail committee. It was decided that each state represented would withdraw and elect or select one woman to be at the head in each state, the Director General to be appointed by the Men's Organization --the following ladies were selected to be at the head of the states represented:

Mrs. Rucks Yerger, of Gulfport, Miss.	--Mississippi
Mrs. J. C. Myrick	Texas
Mrs. A. F. Storm	Louisiana.

Recommendations as presented by Mrs. Bird Enochs were adopted as follows:

That dogwood, etc. be not cut down in localities where these trees grow.

That cottonwood, cactus should not be cut down.

Mrs. Skinner moved that Highways be divided into sections--mark counties. Recommendations referring to Gateways, Oil stations and stores were adopted.

The recommendation offered that Miss Clotilde Nagell be made a member of executive committee was amended to read that a woman be named. Miss Nagell stated that no woman should be made a member who is an employee of the Old Spanish Trail.

Mrs. Sealy of Galveston recommended that a uniform mile post ~~be~~ *giving* consideration to mission bell be adopted showing women's part in
