Hy Bear Judge

Some years ago Capt. Backus (Intelligence Bopt. U.S. Army) and myself dropped in on you; we had been tracing the ancient Spanish trail from Sen Antonic southward. Capt. Backus, soon thereafter, was transferred to foreign parts, and that line of investigation dropped. I want now to come back again and spend time with you or Someone there who is interested in such things in your region; yourself or others. If there is anyone down that way very much interested, you will know.

Such a visit may not be desirable while it is so het. Moreover, I cannot know what may be worthwhile unless you can fewer me with your advice.

I have such information we did not have that first visit. I have associates werking in various divertions, particularly right now down the river to called, and that trails (or these trails) and the trails through Massess are closely associated. I can send a typographical map with Kinds (old can liquel River basin, I understand) in the center. You may have such map. I have the topographical maps of most of the Spanish South Toxas country. The real Camino heal had its getsway thru Laredo. Preside its Rio soon died. The numerous thirilling articles about the great King's Highray across country to Preside del Rio are child's stuff. I an Higuel River.... an Higuelites.... the river basin with plenty of fish, good water, etc., and 400 pages long, some to have been an important. Lorfi (Rec. 1777) describes it. Solis (Aug. 1768) tolls of it. Earta Anna apparently cans up that way. There are indications that fix it on the ancient trail and on the later fan Antoniv-laredo road.

The first trail was across from San Migual to about Pleasanton (near which was El Massose, the San Jose mission ranch), then across to somewhere near the place Now shown as San Agustin Mission (N.E. of Pleasanton), then north thru Massoda Mission ranch, and across the Ledins (east of Lesoya) then to Espada and San Antonio. A San Antonio-Marodo read apparently was that way for a time, then a later San Antonio-Marodo read entered San Antonio over the present Semerset read.

I don't know that this sketched-outline is wholly correct, but we have maps, date, and are piccing things together slowly, and if possible to clear up information down your way it will be mighty helpful, and I am sure, mighty interesting.
