IDENTITY OF SLAYER OF BABY IS UNSOLVED

BRADY, Tex., Feb. 22.—Although every available clue has been run down by McCullough and Brown County officers, local authorities have failed to discover any information leading to the identity of the slayer of the small child, whose nude body was found in the muddy waters of the Colorado River just below the inter-county bridge last Sunday afternoon. The babe's head had apparently been crushed, snuffing out the infant's life before it was hurled into the river, according to W. B. Douglas, justice of the peace, who conducted the inquest.

Sheriff Love Kimbrough and County Attorney Evans Adkins have just returned after making an intensive two-day search and state that this is one of the most gruesome cases of foul play in local criminal annals.

The body had apparently been in the water for two or three days before it was discovered by Johnny Jones of the Milburn community.
