Mrs. F.R.S. Phillips, Tallahassee, Fla., Assistant Secretary of the Old Spanish Trail Association for the East, reports as follows: "The Old Spanish Trail between Tallahassee and the Gadsden County line is in good condition, with the exception of some stretches where it needs to be dragged. The Florida State Road Department is now arranging to give special attention to the trans-continental highways entering Florida, and this will insure frequent patrolling and repairing of the Old Spanish Trail Highway. A gentleman who tours North Florida, from Jacksonville to Pensacola, has sent me this report on the Trail from Pensacola to this city: 'Pensacola to Milton very good via Mulat. The ferry at Mulat leaves every three hours, between 6 A.M. and 6 P.M.; it takes 35 minutes to cross Escambia Bay. Milton to Crestview, very good; Crestview to DeFuniak Springs, very good; DeFuniak Springs to Ponce de Leon, fairly good, except rough in a few places; to Caryville, very good; to Westville, fairly good, except in wet weather water is liable to drown the car; there is a low place near the Choctawhatchie River that will be filled in and made travelable; to Bonifay, good; to Chipley, good; Chipley to Marianna, good; Trail through Gadsden County eastward from the Chattahoochee river (ferry here), is a bit rough, just now, but is usually good; road from Quincy to Tallahassee washed by recent heavy rains, but is being dragged and put in usual fine condition.' I will personally request the State Highway Commissioner and the Board of Commissioners of Leon County to give the Old Spanish Trail good care. "
