

Old S. A. Road according to map of Texas in Thrall's Pictorial History of Texas, p.168:

- Presidio del Rio Grande
- San Antonio
- Bastrop
- Hobbin's Crossing (on Trinity River)
- Nacogdoches
- San Augustine
- Gain's Ferry (On Sabine River)

John Arrowsmith's map of Texas, 1840, compiled from the Land Office records, shows the old S. A. road as follows:

- Presidio del Rio Grande
- S. Jn. Bautisto
- San Antonio de Bexar
- Bastrop
- Tenoxtitlan
- Just east of the Trinity R. a small branch of the road goes up to Crocket and again joins the road farther east.
- Nacogdoches
- San Augustine
- Milam
- Ft. Jesup
- Natchitoches.

*The early entradas, 1690-1721, went this way.
 DeLeon 1689 & 1690 went further east. KTSB-June 9-11 Folio
 Margaret (with Texas 1672) describes where they left the N. Leon trail at
 the Abasco River & turned inland toward the Texas country
 when La Bahia was founded. The trail probably soon took
 a course that way because of the Bahia's rapids and commences
 for conveyance & the best of comfort the presidio offered.
 Rancharia Grande of the Indians, on the Rio Grande near where (1745-1755)
 the San James Mission established, was a great Ind. meeting place, or settlement.
 His runaway Ind. sought refuge there. See 781706 and 781703 + S.X. Ind. + Ind. Index.
 San James Mis. San Gabriel River, period 1745-1755. Then San Marcos, then
 N. Braunfels see p. 180. SA-SX Road then undoubtedly*
