Dear Harral:-
We returned from the Valley Saturday night about 10:30. I arn enclosing you a few of the clippings. This theren us behind time of course. We were due ar Harlingen at 12 and got there at 2:50. I tepephonod ahead and got then to go ahead with the dimner party and postponed the mass meeting from 2:15 to 3;30, and they arranged for the San Benito people to come over there and joint them so we could jump from Harlingen to Dromsville. It the night meeting in Brownville in the Chamber of Comerce every available inch of space was taken, including standing room around the walls, and the outer office was full of wople. The interest was fine. On our return there were about 200 at LaFeria, over 300 at Klercedes, and all the other towns along the line had good crowas.

We had about 250 at McAllenand would have had more only it seems that Secretary Lemis tried to stop the game or didn't carry out his part of the program. I found that onefi the members of the board of directors of the Chamber of Comnerce was an old time friend of mine and used to work for me. I just told him what I thought of inr. Lewis as a commercial secretary and he advised me that he felt just like I did. Wd Bentley is President of the Chamber of Commerce and Ed also expreschinimself the same way. At 3 o'clock that afternoon the voard of directors had Roy Hardin, secretary at Iission, come ovex and they hired him away from lission. ltr. Lewis was out of town and I guess he is looking for another job by this tirae.
