Dear Mr. LeBlanc:

I saw by press despatches that the Louisiana Legislature is in special session, to consider war measures. Can you get Mr. Irvine or Mr. Craft to go over there and present to the Senate and House a memorial similar to that passed by the Florida Legislature concerning the Trail? It would be a good move? As Mr. Irvine is such a peach of a talker (as President Pillans very truthfully puts it) he would be a dandy to send to plead the OST cause, and he and Mr. Craft ought to win. Get President Pillans to go, too?

The Florida delegates are asking when the trip to Washington is to be made, and would like to have reasonable notice. Hope you can get the other states to appoint their delegates, and communities to assist in the expenses of the trip. I will get our people to come across the \$2.50 per thousand, for our 7,000. Has Mr. Conroy begun his canvas for the County subscription of \$2.50 per month? Stir him up? I am "playing" for a car, and if I win, will go after some of these backward counties and make them fix up their part of the Trail, taking along the committee that was appointed at the Convention; or, we will borrow a car and go over the Trail to Jax. Have asked Mrs. W.S. Jennings, President of the Florida Federation of Women's Clubs to ask the FFWC to take up this matter with the County Commissioners between here and Jax: when women go after things, they move? But, the Committee must also work, and I will keep after them. You are the one to "name the day" for us to go to Washington, so do get busy: we are dying to go North. Best regards.
