the kind and other use, 1513 to please "the Fountain of
Truth" owner. I called the attention of the Somed Leon
Com. to the fact that if they used the date 1513 they could
not say Ponce landed on Easter day as the only season
for 1513 was that Easter in that year came on March
27th one week before Ponce landed on April 3rd. I use
the date 1512 because it is the date officially accepted
by Spain and all the early writers excepting La Vega
who uses 1513 and Las Casas 1511. I have traced Ponce
myself & calculated it as well as I can, and find Easter
came on March 27th 1513 by our time. The calendar being
out about 9 or 10 days, the date would have been March
17th too early. To use the Church rules and Easter would
have then come in the first of noon in April. I have read
an account of Ponce de X in his great procession to the
Cathedral April 11th ¹⁵¹³ was the date on December and
the people threw talen branches before him, it sounds
much like Palm Sunday. To find exactly what day was
celebrated as Easter in 1512 and 1513 one must get
back into contemporary history, books printed or written
those years. According to history the battle of Ravenna
was fought on Easter April 11th 1512. I do not
know of the books I have read an old or new time.
The accounts of the battle of Casten de Loid, Chavalir
Bayard did do not mention that it was Easter day. I have
not been near his libraries to hunt this up. Pedro Ponce
de Leon & Cubel an historian wrote to me and asked
Mr. H. Augustine used 1513 when the Spanish Govern-
ment used 1512 after searching the archives.
