"New Orleans to Donaldson is good; on the West side of the River.

Donaldson to Thibodeaux is good but parts need improvement.

Thibodeaux to Morgan City is poor.

Morgan City to New Iberia is good.

New Oberia to Crowley is bad.

Crowley to Lake Charles is a find Highway.

Lake Charles to Orange good with bad spots.

Orange to Beaumont is poor, the shelled part being bad places."

Los Angeles Examiner of April 29th has a column article in connection with trip of Mr. O. E. Aultmand from New Orleans to California over "The Old Spanish Frail" part of which report follows:-

"Mr. Aultman has much to say for the Cld Spanish
Trail Highway, over which the journey was made, and expressed
wonder that more winter touring is not done on this 'All
season' route. 'The roads are excellent from New Orleans to
Phoenix, and the stretches of poor roads between Phoenix
and Yuma are easily mastered if the car is good."
