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The Photo Collections are not only invaluable guides to the type and character of the Spanish works but they promise numerous illustrations for any and all publications. This collection should be steadily added to. The exploring trips will bring forth many valuable photographs, and across the continent are photographers and individuals ready to give valuable old photos and photostats when the time comes. The transcontinental studies and collections are an essential background and guide to the interpretation of many phases of the Spanish centuries. The special publication of the photographic collection has been planned for many years; Old Spanish Trail people financing its costs. (See items under Studies in Progress.)

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Etchings and Engravings. I have collections of these, and artists have assured me we may have and use anything they produce. An Old Spanish Trail handbook, to include these line drawings in large number, is ready for publication except for San Antonio items and data not yet satisfactorily analysed.

Stereoptican Lectures as a means of exciting interest ^{are} is planned. Many slides and old photos are ready. In addition, Adolph Phillips is accumulating rare photos and prints and slides. His cooperation has been nice.

Radio Talks once a week can, I am certain, be arranged, sponsored and financed. This will spread information and also develop cooperation and new leads and data.

The publication of "Preliminary Studies" and of "Approved Studies" must be financed. Important information is dying with individuals because there is no cooperation to foster publication or for the deposit of material that should be preserved. Others cannot, alone, complete studies in which they are interested. Historical material and personal knowledge of old inhabitants are being lost forever thru death and carelessness. ^{Very} Valuable material was lost in the San Antonio flood of 1921.

"Preliminary Studies" should be published to bring out information to complete them. An "Approved Study" should be published when a Board of Editors shall have authorized it. All publications should be handled according to some code, carefully worked out, so that carelessness may be minimized and correctness established, and authority given to the studies and ~~their~~ ^{its} conclusions.
