
Dear Sir:

In response to your letter of September 24 we beg to say that a leaflet such as you inclose, headed "Old Spanish Trail System of Highways" may be registered under the statutory designation of ~~road mark~~ upon deposit of two copies promptly after publication with the statutory notice, accompanied by an application and affidavit on the inclosed Form Al, and a money order for \$1.00 to pay the statutory fee.

The law provides that the copyright secured "shall protect all the copyrightable component parts of the work copyrighted." If the print of the road mark is proper subject of copyright it would therefore be protected by the general copyright of the leaflet in which it appears.
