I beg to acknowledge copy of your letter of the 24th ultimo to Mr. J. M. Calhoun, V. P. at Tallahassee. I note that the Alabama Directors approve of the appointment of Mr. Wm. Herrider, of Pensacola as General Supervisor of Florida, and this appointment meets with my hearty approval. Mr. Herrider is an enthusiastic and energetic good roads man, and I think he will continue to, as he has been doing.

On account of my repeated absence from the office I have not sent you any communications recently. I would say that the County Road Forces are now at work on the Old Spanish Trail, grading down hills, raising hills, and scraping the roads, and the County Commissioners expect to keep the entire road force on this work until the road is put in good shape.

We are still waiting for some active steps to be taken in the matter of building the bridge across the Chattahoochee River. This is one of the most important links in the Old Spanish Trail, and as the Government and Jackson County has promised to stand their share, can see no reason why the bridge cannot be built promptly.
