Dear Herbert.

I have finally accomplished the instalation of an Executive Committee of substantial citizens, with power to control policies and practices as your Beard of Directors do there. This, as a first thing, stops at once the lose things the President here has been fostering. Fort we will head up to an Advisory Foard of delegates from the civic and commercial brightsations, and the cby that han Amburio officially and flatly behind this work. At the convention we will plan for a rational board of directors and this local organization to function and co-ordinate so that never again can a single official assume the power to upset things as has been done in Texas, and reaching take Charles as in the Prancis case.

We have a bunch of bad problems to clean up, but I believe San Artonio (with all her burdens) will go into the convention with thirgs cleared up and stand ready with the rest of you to put and heef this off work straight.

I had expected to be in Louisiana long before this; and as you know had expected a convention in Tovember -- but will not dare leave again until I see this Executive Committee thereby in charge, and the office purified. The President would not have done some of the things he did if Colo, the man I loft in charge, had not joined to work out their own pet things.
