Columbus, Sept. 23, 1922

Old Spanish Trail Association,

Gentlemen,-

The Naelder people do not feel any too kindly toward the OST on account of advertising proposition. It was like pulling an eye tooth to get \$0 00

Platonis felt the same way and Mr. Rosenauer says he is absolutely thru with the OST as everything is going out and nothing coming in, and lays great stress on not receiving the strip map.

Schulenburg, Mr. Baumgartner could not come out, but pledged he would collect a larger amount than their quota and would need it in. He is going to call a meeting at Seguin, Gonzales, Naelder, Platonis and Rosenburg in the very near future. Please keep after him.

and says:

"After deducting 25% commission I am enclosing checks amounting to \$97 50"

The receipt blanks show that fifteen of the "memberships" are for \$5 00 each. There is no \$5 00 membership; that was abolished at the CalSport convention.

The receipts also read, "Dues paid to October 1, 1922" Memberships are regulated by the constitution and by-laws to run according to the calendar year.
