

RESOLUTION NO 2

WHEREAS: The War Department has now declared the Old Spanish Trail system a military necessity of first importance, and the senators and congressmen of the southern borderland states have joined in a declaration classing it as one of the basic highways of the United States, and all OST states have now rated it as of primary importance on the maps submitted to the United States Road Bureau in pursuance of the Federal Aid law,

AND WHEREAS: The national convention of the Old Spanish Trail will soon be called, and many important questions must be acted upon,

THEREFORE RESOLVED: That we ask the civic and commercial organizations of San Antonio (Rotary, Kiwanis, City, Salesmanship, Advertising, Canopus, Lions and women's clubs, Chamber of Commerce, Real Estate Board, Hotel Keepers Association, Auto League, Elks and T.P.A.) to appoint two delegates each to a meeting to be held at the Gunter Hotel, Friday October 27th, 4 P.M.---

1. To plan more comprehensively for San Antonio's part in the leadership entrusted to her in this big, national project, and

2. To plan for and invite the councilors and members of the OST in Texas to meet at San Antonio to consider more intimately the interests of the Texas divisions of the highway, and

3. To organize these Texas members to help the Texas/highway leaders in their work to preserve Federal Aid to the state. Under the Federal law Federal Aid will be discontinued after November 1924 if the state fails to comply with Federal provisions for the construction and maintenance of the highways accepted as a part of the federal system.
