Dear Mr. LeBlanc:

I wish to thank you again for your courtesy to me, while in Mobile, and also for recommending my appointment to Washington. I received the appointment from Governor Catts, this morning, and feel very proud of it. Have given it to the local and Jax papers, with the story of the Mobile Conference.

Dr. Conradi, Acting President of this Club, called upon Governor Catts, yesterday and asked to have the telegram I had prepared (in re. Marginal Military Highway Bill) to be sent to the five Florida representatives in the Congress. The telegram was signed by the Governor and his entire Cabinet, this morning, and was immediately wired to Senators Duncan U. Fletcher and Park Trammell, and Congressmen Frank Clark, Walter Kehoe and H. J. Drain. We also sent one signed by D.M. Lowry, Mayor; Tallahassee Boosters' Club, by Dr. Edward Conradi, Acting President; R.G. Johnson, Chairman Board of County Commissioners of Leon County; W.F. Cooke, State Highway Commissioner; W.L. Moor, President Southern Telephone Co.; G.W. Saxon, Vice-President Dixie Highway Association (who is a vice-president of this Club); and myself, as "Asst. Sec'y. OST Association for the East". Do you think that they will think we are interested? You have one guess? Please tell President Pillans, Mr. Irvine and Capt. Craft. I have sent a copy to Mr. Clemens.

When I get the avalanche of mail out of the way, will write you about other matters. Best wishes.
